Implementation of OBE and NEP

Poornima University states that its curriculum is aligned with the guidelines of the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP-2020) and follows an Outcome-Based Education (OBE) framework. This approach ensures that the University structures its courses around clearly defined learning outcomes, skills, and competencies, rather than solely focusing on content, thereby preparing students effectively for both industry and research. At the Faculty of Management & Commerce (FMC), the University emphasizes transparent evaluation, industry institute partnerships, and a student-centric learning environment, which are key hallmarks of OBE-compliant pedagogy. This demonstrates Poornima University’s proactive approach toward innovative, outcome-focused, and industry-relevant higher education, reflecting its commitment to delivering a contemporary, skill-oriented, and holistic learning experience in line with national educational reforms.

SDG Goals, Sustainability and Implementation in Curriculum / Campus

PU appears to take environmental sustainability seriously. The university campus has a 350 KLD Sewage Treatment Plant (STP), Contributing to its “Certified Green Campus” status. Additionally, there is a roof-top solar power plant (250 KW) on campus, solar water heaters in hostels, indicating commitment to renewable energy and energy efficiency. PU claims to have established “Centres of Excellence” (CoEs) focused on areas such as Clean Air & Water Resources, Solar Energy, and Machine Learning through its iNCENT initiative. These indicate that sustainability and environmental concerns are integrated not just in campus infrastructure but also in academic and research priorities.

By combining green-campus infrastructure (water treatment, solar energy, waste management) with academic and research focus on sustainability, PU addresses certain goals aligned with global development agendas (e.g., clean energy, clean water, sustainable cities/communities).

Research and Innovation

Research and innovation are among the pillars of PU’s mission. Some key highlights:

- PU claims **650+ Scopus/SCI-indexed publications**: indicating a substantial volume of peer-reviewed research output. Over **200+copyrights & patents** have been filed/awarded.
- The university provides funding for R&D: reportedly ₹2.25 crore in R&D ventures.

- Through the Faculty of Innovation, Research and Entrepreneurship (FIRE) and the integrated nodal centre (iNCENT), PU provides infrastructure and support for startups, entrepreneurship, and novel technology development.
- PU claims existence of multiple active research groups (in areas like AI, IoT, Renewable Energy, Civil-Tech etc.), and supports projects, workshops, conferences, and industry-collaborative research.
- Thus, PU combines academic teaching with research endeavors, innovation, startup support enabling students and faculty to engage in knowledge creation, not just consumption.

Poornima University places strong emphasis on social responsibility as a core focus area. Its green campus initiatives, including water treatment, solar power, and waste management, reflect a firm commitment to environmental sustainability and community well-being. 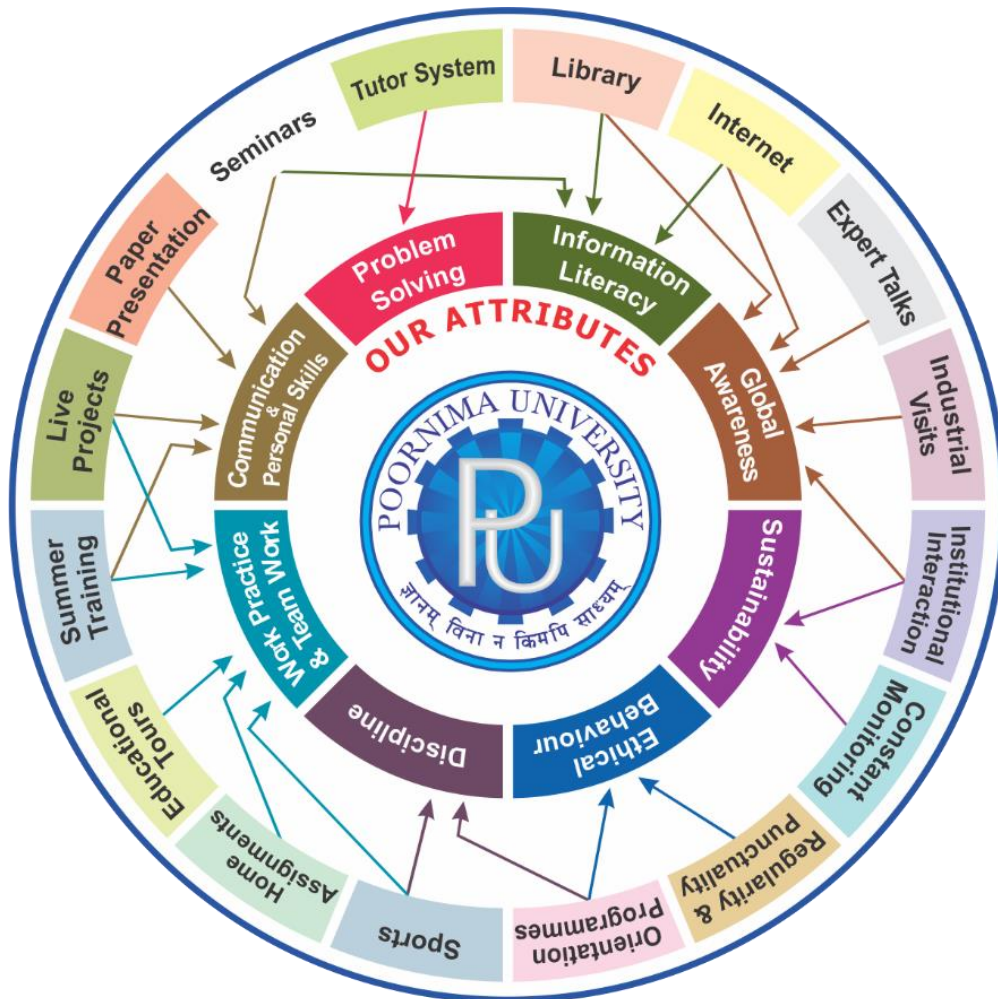
Our vision is to create a knowledge-based society with a scientific temper, team spirit, and dignity of labor to face global competitive challenges.

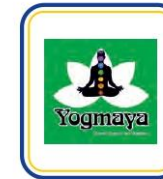

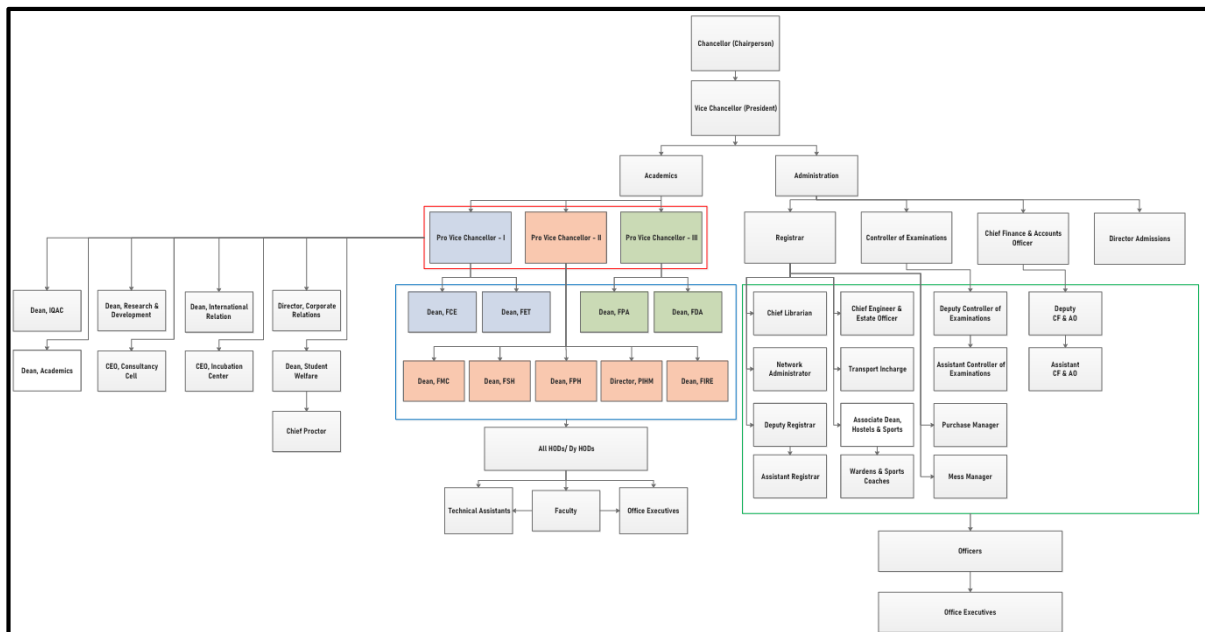

STATUTORY BODIES

Constitution, Meetings, Powers and Functions of the Authorities The Board of Management

Constitution, meetings, powers and functions of the Board.-

(1) (a) Nomination, in terms of clauses (c), (d), (e), and (g) of subsection (1) of section 22 of the Act shall be made for three years from the date of the nomination.

(b) No person shall continue to be a member of the Board of Management in more than one capacity and whenever a person becomes such member in more than one capacity, he shall, within two weeks thereof, intimate to the Member-Secretary, in writing, as to the capacity in which he desires to be such member and vacate the other seat, failing which the seat held by him earlier in point of time shall be deemed to have been vacated. The seat so vacated shall be filled as per the provisions of the Act.

(c) Nomination of such members in terms of clause d, e, g of section 22 of the Act shall not be made for more than two terms.

Provided that such member who have completed two continuous term can be nominated after a gap of three years.

(2) Meetings of the Board. (a) The meetings of the Board shall be convened by the Chairperson. The Chairperson shall preside over the meetings of the Board. In the absence of the Chairperson at any meeting of the Board, for any reason whatever, a member of the Board, nominated by the Chairperson, shall preside over such meeting.

(b) (i) The Member-Secretary shall, under the direction of the Chairperson, give a notice of not less than ten days, of a meeting of the Board: Provided that if the date fixed for the meeting is changed to a date later than the date fixed, fresh prior notice of not less than 24 hours shall be necessary.

(ii) The Member-Secretary shall issue, at least five days before the date of a meeting, the agenda showing the business to be brought before the meeting. The Member-Secretary shall endeavor to ensure and confirm the receipt of the same by every member by e-mail and/or telephone at least two days prior to the date of meeting.

(c) (i) The Chairperson may, at his discretion, convene an urgent meeting of the Board at a short notice of not less than two days.

(ii) The Member-Secretary shall, along with the notice of such urgent meeting, send a statement of business to be transacted at the meeting to all concerned at least one day in advance by messenger / fax / e-mail and shall endeavor to get confirmed the receipt by all normally at least twelve hours before the meeting. such urgent meeting, if convened, shall be treated as a meeting under sub-section (3) of section 22 of the Act.

(d) Any member who wishes to move a proposal to be included in the agenda of a meeting shall forward a copy of such proposal to the Member- Secretary so as to reach him not later than seven days before the date fixed for such meeting. The Member-Secretary shall place all such proposals received from the members of the Board for inclusion on the agenda before the Chairperson in time, who shall direct the Member- Secretary to include in the agenda such proposals as are, in his discretion, admissible.

(e) (i) If the quorum is not present within thirty minutes after the appointed time for a meeting, the meeting shall be adjourned. The Member-Secretary shall make record of the fact which shall be signed by the Chairperson.

- (ii) If at any point of time during the progress of the meeting, any member calls attention to the number of members present, the Chairperson shall, within a reasonable time, count the number of the members present, and, if a quorum is not present he shall adjourn the meeting. Any such adjournment shall be recorded by the Member-Secretary and shall be signed by the Chairperson.
- (f) At an adjourned meeting, no business, other than that on the agenda of the original meeting, shall be taken up for consideration.
- (g) The Chairperson or any other person nominated by him in his absence, shall be the sole judge of any point of order raised at a meeting.
- (h) Every question shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting. In case of equality of votes, the Chairperson or any other person nominated by him in his absence, shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member.
- (i) A member who dissents from a decision of the Board and expresses a desire to give a note of dissent shall always be brief and be confined to the main point at issue. Personal reference of any kind as also attributing of motives shall invariably be avoided. The dissenting note given by a member shall be circulated along with the proceedings of the meeting.
- (j) After every meeting or adjourned meeting of the Board, the Registrar shall within ten working days prepare the draft of the minutes and shall submit the same to the Chairperson for approval. The Chairperson may make such alterations as necessary and shall approve the same after corrections, if any.
- (k) The minutes so approved by the Chairperson shall be sent to all the members of the Board of Management, whether they were present at the meeting or not.
- (l) The minutes of the meeting after confirmation shall be uploaded on the website of the university and shall not be removed.

(3) Additional Powers and Functions of the Board.- Subject to such conditions as have been prescribed by or under the Act, the Board shall have the following additional powers and perform the following functions, namely:-

- (i) To hold, control and administer property and funds of the University;
- (ii) To administer any fund or resources placed at the disposal of the University for a specific purpose;
- (iii) To manage and invest moneys belonging to the University;
- (iv) To enter into, vary, carry out, confirm and cancel contracts on behalf of the University;
- (v) To borrow money or raise loans for the purpose of the University on the security of the Property of the University or any other security;
- (vi) To approve the appointment of officers (other than the Chairperson, President, Registrar and the Deans of the Schools), teachers and to define their duties, emoluments and Conditions of service subject to the provisions of these Statutes;
- (vii) To determine the form, provide for the custody, and regulate the rules of the common Seal of the University;
- (viii) To arrange for holding of examinations and preparing results thereof;
- (ix) To ensure maintenance of proper standards of excellence in teaching and examination in consultation with Academic Council;
- (x) To acquire copyrights, trade-marks, patents or the like for any intellectual property Produced or created by the University;
- (xi) To enter into collaboration with other Universities/Institutions within or without India for

- Promotion of academic excellence research and consultancy etc;
- (xii) To determine scales of salaries of employees which shall not be less than the scales Prescribed by the UGC/Regulatory Bodies/State Government;
- (xiii) To create or abolish any teaching or non-teaching post(s) as per norms of Regulatory Bodies; and
- (xiv) To create new department, abolish or restructure existing department in the University As per provisions of the Act and Regulatory Bodies. Provided that the regularly Employed persons of abolished departments shall be treated as per relevant clause of Conditions of appointment and removal.
- (xv) To constitute fee committee as per provision of section 33 of the Act, in case no such Committee has been constituted by the State Government, including at least one nominee of the State Government nominated by the Secretary, Higher Education.

The Academic Council

Academic Council-composition and term of office.-

1. (a) The Academic Council shall consist of the following, namely:-

- (i) The President;
- (ii) The Pro-President;
- (iii)The Deans of the Schools;
- (iv)The Heads of the University Department of the status of a Professor or an Associate Professor;
- (v) The Conveners of the Board of Studies; and
- (vi)Three persons co-opted by the Academic Council possessing special attainments in particular studies and who are not teachers in the University

(b) The term of office of a member, other than ex-officio member, of the Academic Council, shall be three years.

(c) No person shall continue to be member of the Academic council in more than one capacity. Whenever a person becomes such member in more than one capacity, he shall, within two weeks thereof, intimate to the Member-Secretary, in writing, as to the capacity in which he desires to be such member and vacate the other seat; failing which the seat held by him earlier in point of time shall be deemed to have been vacated.

2. Meeting of the Academic Council.-

- (a) The President shall preside over the meeting of the Academic Council. In the absence of the President, Pro-President shall preside over the meeting.
- (b) Meeting of the Academic Council shall be held at least twice in a year.
- (c) The Registrar shall act as Member-Secretary of the Academic Council.
- (d) The Member Secretary shall under the direction of the President circulate a written notice of not less than seven days together with a copy of the agenda to the members of the Academic Council; Provided that if the date fixed for meeting is changed to a date later than the date fixed, fresh prior notice of not less than 48 hours shall be necessary.

- (e) (i) the quorum for a meeting of the Academic Council shall be five members including the President. If the quorum is not complete within thirty minutes after the time appointed for the meeting, the meeting shall not be held and the Member-Secretary shall make a record of the fact and the same shall be signed by the President;
- (ii) if, at any point of time during the progress of a meeting, any member calls attention to the number of members present, the President shall, within a reasonable time, count the number of members present, and if a quorum is not present, he shall adjourn the meeting. Every such adjournment shall be recorded and shall be signed by the President;
- (f) The President may convene a meeting to consider matters which, in his opinion, are urgent giving a notice shorter than seven days. Provided that if the date fixed for meeting is changed to a date later than the date fixed, fresh prior notice of not less than 48 hours shall be necessary.
- (g) The rulings of the President in regard to all questions of procedure in respect of the meetings of the Academic Council shall be final.
- (h) Decisions at the meetings of the Academic Council shall be taken by a majority vote of the members present and voting at the meeting. The President shall be entitled to exercise a casting vote in case votes are equally divided.
- (i) The proceedings of the meetings of the Academic Council shall be recorded by the Member-Secretary. In the absence of the Registrar, the President shall appoint any other person to act as Member-Secretary.

3. Powers and functions of the Academic Council.-

The Academic Council shall exercise the following powers and perform the following functions, namely;-

- (i) To make, amend and cancel Regulations laying down courses of study and curricula as per Schedule-II of the Act and permission granted under section 4 of the Act, subject to the approval of the Board;
- (ii) To propose to the Board, Ordinances concerning admission to the University or to its examinations, courses of study and curricula, schemes of examination and attendance: provided that proposals regarding courses of study and curricula and schemes of examination as per Schedule-II of the Act and permission granted under section 4 of the Act, shall be made after consulting, if necessary, a department, Board of studies/school concerned;
- (iii) To make proposals regarding the maintenance of standards of teaching and examination;
- (iv) To advise the Board regarding teaching posts in a particular subject / specialties;
- (v) To advise the Board regarding the institution of the Board of Studies and their strength after consulting the recommendations of the School concerned;
- (vi) To advise the Board a fees committee constituted as per section 33 of the Act for proposed fee structure regarding University fees;
- (i) To advise the Board regarding equivalency of examinations and lateral entry recognition of examinations of other bodies as per the regulations/guidelines of regulatory bodies;

- (ii) to advise the Board regarding University Library and the appointment of a University Library Committee;
- (iii) to advise the Board regarding the conditions of award and tenure of University Scholarships and other benefits;
- (iv) To refer matters to Schools and the Boards of Studies; (ix) To promote research;
- (v) To advise the Board regarding all academic matters;
- (vi) To report on any matter referred to or delegated to it by the Board;
- (vii) To issue directions regarding methods of instruction, coordination of teaching, evaluation of research and maintenance and improvement of academic standards;
- (viii) To promote coordination between various Schools, Departments, and collaboration between the University and other institutions of higher learning and constitute such committees as may be deemed necessary for the purpose;
- (ix) To consider matters of general academic interest either on its own initiative, or on a reference by a school, Department and to take appropriate action thereon;
- (x) To move proposals to the Board for approval regarding creation, abolition, subdivision etc. of Schools, Departments, Boards of Studies and the like, of the University;
- (xi) To consider and recommend to the Board proposals submitted by any Board of Studies, School or Research Board in respect of courses of study and research programmes as per prevailing UGC Regulations wherever applicable;
- (xii) To recommend to the Board the appointment of visiting Professors, Emeritus Professors, consultants, and scholars as per UGC norms;
- (xiii) To recommend for approval to the Board any rules and regulations for the award of the degree of M.Phil. and Doctor of Philosophy as per UGC Regulations;
- (xiv) To consider proposals for admitting thesis for the award of the degree of M. Phil and Doctor of Philosophy in the relevant school of the University, which has qualified teachers, infrastructure facilities, and post-graduation programs as per UGC Regulations;
- (xv) To make recommendation to the Board about – (a) the Degrees, Diplomas and Certificates to be awarded by the University and the conditions for their award; (b) the creation or abolition of posts required for teaching in the University; (c) the classification of the posts referred to in sub-clause (b) above and the duties attached thereto as per UGC norms and or statutory regulatory bodies; (d) fixation of remuneration payable to the examiners;
- (xvi) To constitute Equivalence Committee of expert members to recognize Degrees, Diplomas or Certificates of other Universities or Institutions and to determine their corresponding value in relation to the Diplomas and Degrees of the University in accordance with the provisions of Association of Indian Universities, University Grants Commission and any other like national body or authority and policies of the Government; Provided that all such decisions regarding equivalence shall be given wide publicity through university notifications and publication on website.
- (xvii) To recommend institution of stipends, scholarships, medals, and prizes and to fix, subject to any conditions accepted by the Board, the time, mode and conditions of award of fellowships, scholarships, medals, and other prizes;
- (xviii) To recommend to the Board an academic calendar including an examination schedule for all the courses covered under the semester/ annual scheme;
- (xix) To suggest such forms, formats of documents and registers as are, from time to time, prescribed by the Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Rules or Regulations; and
- (xx) To perform, in relation to academic matters, all such duties and to do all such acts as may be necessary for the proper carrying out of the provisions of the Act, the Statutes, the Ordinances or the Rules.

The Schools

(1) Schools of the University

Subject to the provisions of the Act, the University shall have the Schools according to the subject mentioned in Schedule-II of the Act and permitted subjects under Section 4 of the Act. Provided that the courses taught by the schools shall bear the titles of programmes as per the UGC Regulations regarding specified degrees.

(2) Schools - Composition and term of office

(a) Each school shall consist of following, namely: -

- (i) The Dean of the School;
- (ii) University Professors and Associate Professors in the subjects assigned to the school;
- (iii) All Heads of the Departments within the school;
- (iv) Two members co-opted by the school concerned from among the teachers of the school;
- (v) Three persons not being teachers in the University to be coopted by the School; and
- (vi) The Conveners of Board of Studies in the School, who are not otherwise included under the foregoing clauses.

(b) Member of a School other than ex-officio member shall hold office for a period of three years.

(3) Meetings of the Schools.

- (a) Meeting of a school shall be held whenever convened by the Dean when advised by the President.
- (b) One third of the members shall constitute the quorum.
- (c) Notice of meeting of a School shall be sent to each member by the Registrar on the directions of the President or the advice of the Dean of School stating the date, time and place of the meeting and also showing the agenda of the meeting. The period of notice shall ordinarily be five days unless the Dean of the School, for reasons of urgency, requires a notice of less than five days.
- (d) The President may convene joint meetings of two or more Schools for the purpose of considering any matter common to them and shall preside over such meeting. In the absence of the President, any Dean nominated by him, shall preside.

(4) Functions of the Schools

- (i) To recommend to the Academic Council course(s) of study, curricula and scheme (s) of examination, prepared by the Board of Studies in accordance with the provisions of regulatory bodies;
- (ii) To report to the Board of Management through the Academic Council, the institution, composition or abolition of any Board of Studies;
- (iii) To recommend to the Academic Council the establishment, sub-division and abolition etc. of the Departments within the Schools;
- (iv) To consider any matter referred to it by the Board or the Academic Council;
- (v) To consider any report or recommendation referred to the School by the Board of Studies before making recommendations to the Academic Council;
- (vi) To make suggestions or recommendations to the Board through Academic Council regarding organization of teaching or research or examination in the subjects concerned with the School; (vii) To recommend to the Academic Council conditions for the award of Degrees, Diplomas and other academic distinctions;
- (viii) To refer any matter to the Board of Studies within the School;
- (viii) Any other function required to be performed under the Act, Statutes, Ordinances, or rules of the University.

5. In Exercise of the power conferred under section 21

- (iv) Of the Act, the following are declared as 'other authorities' of the University, namely.-
 - (a) Board of Studies;
 - (b) Finance Committee;
 - (c) Advanced Studies & Research Committee, and
 - (d) Publication Board.

Board of Studies

1. Board of studies, Composition and term of office.-

- (a) There shall be a Board of Studies for each subject or group of subjects.
- (b) The Board of Studies shall be constituted by the School concerned for a period of three years.
- (c) The number of the Boards of Studies in each School as also the members of each Board of Studies shall be determined by the Board of Management on the recommendations of the Academic Council and the School concerned.
- (d) The members of a Board of Studies shall not exceed five, out of which three of them shall be internal members and out of these three one shall be Head of the Department and the remaining members shall be teachers of the Post-graduate departments.
- (e) There shall be at least one and not more than two external members on each Board of Studies. (f) Board of Studies shall elect a convener from amongst its members.
- (g) The Convener shall convene meeting of the Board of Studies. The quorum of the meeting shall be one half of the total members.
- (h) The Dean shall have right to be present and speak at the meetings of the Boards of Studies relating to his school but not to vote thereat unless he is a member thereof.

Explanation: - 'Internal member' means a member who is a teacher in the University and 'external member' means one who is a subject expert and not connected with university in any manner.

(2) Each Board of Studies shall perform the following functions, namely.-

- (i) To recommend courses of study, curricula and scheme of examinations in its respective subject(s) and shall advise on all matters relating thereto referred to it by the Board of Management or the Academic Council or the School concerned;
- (ii) To bring to the notice of the Academic Council or the Board of Management matters connected with examination in its subject or subjects and may also address the School concerned on any matter connected with the improvement of its courses;
- (iii) To hold a joint meeting of two or more boards of studies, with the consent of the President, or on the advice of the Academic Council or the Board of Management, and act in concurrence and render a joint report upon any matter which lies within the province of such boards of Studies. In such cases the joint meeting shall elect its own Chairman from amongst the conveners of various boards of Studies;
- (iv) To prepare panels of examiners in their respective subjects. Provided that no person shall be qualified for appointment as an examiner in final semester/annual examination in a subject unless he has taught the subject at last three years up to the standard of examination and possess five years' teaching experience in that subject.

Provided that each Board of Studies shall prepare a panel consisting of:-

- (i) All qualified internal examiners.
- (ii) As many external examiners as may be needed for conducting examinations of the university for a period of five years in each subject for each examination. Provided that in every final semester/annual examination at least 50% examiners shall be from higher education institutions not connected with the University and which are not managed by the sponsoring body of the University;
- (v) To advise the University Authorities on examination reforms;
- (vi) To prepare panel of proposed examiners for the University examinations and recommend the same to the President; and
- (vii) To advise the University Authorities on any matter referred to it.

The Finance Committee

(1) Composition and term of office

- (a) There shall be a Finance Committee to advise the Board on matters relating to finance. It shall meet at least once in a financial year.
- (b) The Finance Committee shall be constituted for a term of three years.
- (c) the Finance Committee shall consist of the following namely;- (i) the Chairperson; (ii) the President; (iii) two members nominated by the Board from amongst its members; (iv) two members nominated by the sponsoring body; (v) the Registrar; and (vi) the Chief Finance and Accounts Officer - Member Secretary.
- (d) Four members shall constitute the quorum.

(2) The Finance Committee shall perform the following functions, namely:

- (i) To examine the Annual Budget Assessment and advise the Board thereon;
- (ii) To review the accounts of the University and audit objections and replies thereto; and to make recommendations to the Board on all matters relating to finance of the University and any development program of the University.

The Advanced Studies & Research Committee

The Advance Studies & Research Committees

(1) Composition and term of office:

(a) The Research Board shall consist of the following, namely:-

- (i) The President; - Chairman
- (ii) Chairman of the Ethics Committee – member
- (iii) The Pro-President; - Member
- (iv) Head of each University teaching Department; - member
- (v) The Deans of Schools; - member, and
- (vi) The Registrar.

(b) One-third of the total members of the Research Board shall form the quorum. In the absence of the President, the Pro-President shall preside at the meeting.

(c) The recommendations of the Research Board shall be submitted to the Academic Council for its consideration.

(d) The Research Board shall meet at least twice in one academic session.

(2) The Research Board shall perform the following functions, namely

- (i) To recommend the names of qualified teachers from post graduate departments of the University who are eligible for guiding research work as per prevailing UGC Regulations;
- (ii) To suggest process of registration for Doctoral Degrees through entrance examination as specified in prevailing UGC Regulations;
- (iii) To suggest ways to maintain quality and relevance of research and to ensure prevention of plagiarism,
- (iv) To suggest mechanism to ensure compliance of prevailing UGC Regulations regarding M.Phil. and Ph.D. Degrees, and
- (v) To perform such other functions, as may be assigned to it by the Board of Management or the Academic Council with regard to the maintenance of standards and promotion of research.

The Publication Board

(1) Composition and term of office

- (a) The Publication Board shall consist of the following, namely:-
 - (i) The President;
 - (ii) The Pro-president;
 - (iii) The Deans of the Schools;
 - (iv) The University Librarian;
 - (v) Coordinator of University website.
- (b) The Publication Board shall meet at least once in a year or whenever convened by the President. (c) Five members shall form a quorum for the meeting of the Publication Board.
- (d) The President shall be the Chairman of the Publication Board and in his absence the Pro-President shall preside.

(2) The Publication Board shall undertake, with the sanction of the Board of Management, the publication of

- (i) University Journal;
- (ii) Such of the results of post-graduate studies and research as the Board of Management may entrust for publication;
- (iii) Any other work, literary or scientific, considered suitable by the Academic Council;
- (v) University extension lectures or extramural lectures.
- (vi) Information required as per norms of the regulatory body and the State Government on the website of the University.

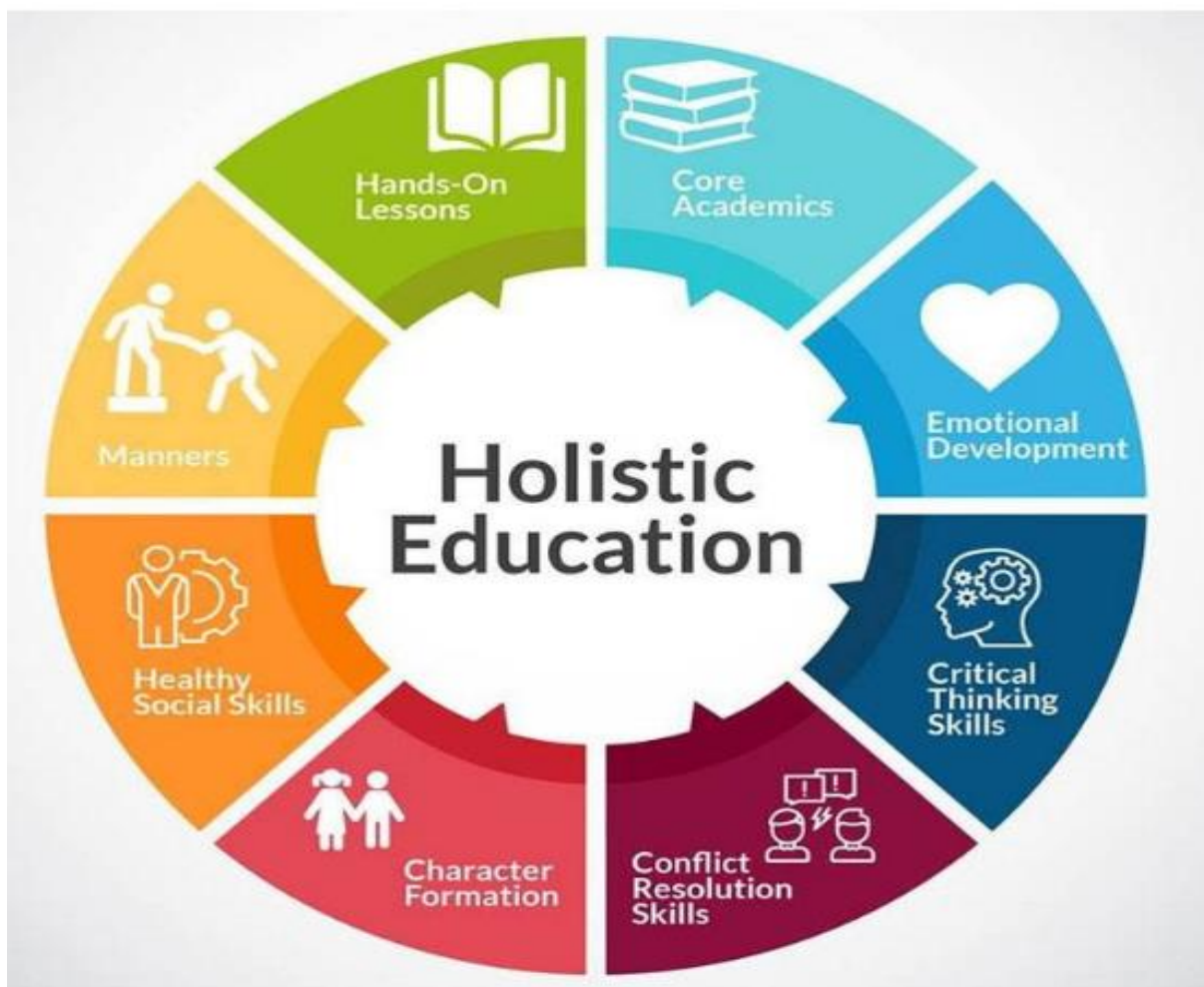

The Dean's office is also part of major university events and is listed as a patron or co-patron in committees for university-level conferences or programs highlighting its involvement in shaping the student community.
